The ideal candidate will have

- Excellent communication skills, including experience in report writing,
- Interest in learning and applying concepts of auditing, safety management systems, fatigue management, and safety culture.
- Ability to work independently while contributing effectively to a team.
- Familiarity with critical incident stress programs is a plus but not required.

Duties:

- Assist in conducting audits related to safety management systems to evaluate compliance and effectiveness.
- Support the development and assessment of fatigue mitigation plans, specifically passenger hours of service programs.
- Contribute to the analysis and improvement of safety culture initiatives throughout the organization.
- Collaborate with the team on managing the internal critical incident stress program, providing support and coordination as needed.
- Prepare clear reports that document findings, recommendations, and progress related to audits, SMS activities, and fatigue mitigation efforts.
- Participate in meetings and training sessions to broaden understanding of safety management principles and practices.

Qualifications: Candidates must currently be a GS-13 or GS-14, with journeyman-level experience in railroad safety, regulatory enforcement, and stakeholder engagement.
