- Before moving, conduct a walk-around inspection of your vehicle. This simple step helps prevent backing accidents, ensures visibility of hazards, and confirms your vehicle is safe for operation.

Backing Procedures

- Railroad vehicles must follow safe backing practices at all times.
- Use of a Spotter: When a passenger is available, most railroads require that they exit the vehicle and serve as a ground guide for backing moves. This simple practice dramatically reduces the risk of collisions. While it may sometimes be overlooked in the field, it remains one of the most effective safeguards. Making the effort to use a spotter helps protect both people and property.
- Never back across a railroad crossing unless it is an emergency situation.

The Passenger's Role in Safety

- Passengers are more than riders. An aware passenger can serve as an extra set of eyes and ears, helping identify hazards the driver may not immediately see.
- Speak up if you notice unsafe speed, fatigue, distractions, or roadway hazards.
- Help monitor blind spots during lane changes or turns.
- Remind the driver of work zone conditions, railroad crossings, or approaching intersections.
- Be ready to act as a ground guide for backing moves, when required

Additional Safety Recommendations

- Obey posted speed limits and reduce speed for weather, traffic, or work zone conditions. Railroad vehicles must set the example for professional operation.
- Eliminate distractions. Mobile devices, paperwork, and food or drink should never take your attention away from driving.
- Ensure lights, mirrors, windshield wipers, and safety equipment are in working order before driving. Defects should be reported and repaired immediately.
- Anticipate seasonal hazards like shorter daylight hours, wet leaves, snow, and ice. Adjust your driving accordingly.
