Why Work For Us?

The Federal Railroad Administration's mission is to enable the safe, reliable, and efficient movement of people and goods for a strong America, now and in the future.

The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) promulgates and enforces rail safety regulations; consolidates government support of rail transportation activities; administers financial assistance programs; conducts research and development in support of improved railroad safety and efficiency, and national transportation policy, including improved intercity passenger service.

FRA is committed to fostering a highly skilled workforce capable of meeting or exceeding our strategic goals with efficiency, innovation, and a constant focus on better serving our customers.

You will serve as a Railroad Safety Inspector (Hazardous Material). As a Hazardous Material (Hazmat) inspector you will be assigned territory covering potentially several states. The inspector has the responsibility for the improvement and advancement of railroad safety and monitoring regulatory compliance of hazardous material shipments by rail within their assigned territory. The demands of the position require skills in the evaluation, fact-finding, report writing; requires comprehension and application of technical and regulatory standards, as well as the ability to gain cooperation of individuals and organizations.

Summary Of The Essential Job Functions: As a Railroad Safety Inspector (Hazardous Materials), you will be required to:

- Plans and carries out an itinerary of periodic inspections at rail hazardous materials shipper/consignee locations including oil & gas refineries/fractionation plants, chemical and explosives manufacturers, rail intermodal terminals/van yards, freight forwarders, import/export agents and tank car manufacturing and repair facilities within their District and neighboring Districts when called upon to conduct team inspections.
- Inspects Class 1, Regional and Short Line railroads for compliance with the hazardous materials regulations and assists in training railroad personnel to enhance compliance with Federal regulations. Conducts railroad accident investigations including train and/or railcar collisions, reportable derailments, Non-Accidental Releases (NAR) of hazardous materials, or other accidents/incidents resulting in serious injury to person(s) or to the property of a railroad occurring on the line of any common carrier engaged in interstate transportation.
- Conducts audits of tank car manufacturing and repair facilities utilizing 49 CFR 100-180, the Tank Car Shop Manual and Tank Car Manufacturer and Repair Facilities Quality Assurance Program (QAP) Manuals.
- Conducts training & provides guidance of newly hired federal and state hazardous

materials inspectors and trainees, advises industry, local and state authorities, rail managers, employees and labor representatives and other interested parties regarding current hazardous materials regulations.

Other Special Job Requirements

- If selected, you will be required to possess and maintain a valid State driver's license at all times while employed by the FRA in order to perform the duties of the position.
- If selected, you will be required to pass a Drug Test prior to appointment unless you are presently employed in a DOT position that requires drug testing. You also will be subject to random drug testing while employed in this safety-sensitive position.
- The position requires extensive travel.
- This position is eligible for Mobile Work, and the selectee must work/reside within the geographic area of the duty location stated above. The duty location for a mobile worker is usually the residence or other approved telework site. The actual duty location is subject to approval by Supervisor. Salary will be adjusted based on the duty location. The actual duty location is subject to approval by the Deputy Staff Director and/or Railroad Safety management. Salary will be adjusted based on the duty location.
- Please note that you may be required to file an annual financial disclosure.
- All employees are subject to the Standards of Ethical Conduct for Employees of the Executive Branch, set out in Title 5 of the Code of Federal Regulations, section 2635, including restrictions on owning financial interests that may conflict with performance of their duties.

How Will The Qualified Applicants Be Further Evaluated And Rated To Identify The Best Qualified?

Railroad Safety Inspector HM-, GS-2121-12, who are interested in voluntary reassignment may apply for the Railroad Safety Inspector, GS-2121-12 positions by applying in accordance with the application procedures outlined in vacancy announcements.

The employee must meet the following criteria below to receive consideration for the voluntary reassignment:

- 1. Occupies the same Railroad Safety Inspector discipline as the vacancy.
 - 2. Has not received any Letters of Reprimand or suspensions within the most recent twelve (12) months.
 - 3. Is not currently under investigation for potential misconduct. If the employee is deemed ineligible due to an ongoing investigation, the employee must be informed they are under investigation.
 - 4. Has a "Fully Successful" or better on their most recent performance appraisal and has not been on a Performance Improvement Plan (PIP) within the most recent twelve (12) months.
 - 5. Has not been voluntarily reassigned within the most recent twelve (12) months.
 - 6. Has the most seniority of applicants, which is defined as:
 - a. Being a Railroad Safety Inspector at the GS-2121-12 level with the earliest FRA Entrance on Duty date based on continuous FRA service; or
 - b. An FRA candidate with the earliest promotion date to the position of Railroad Safety Inspector, GS-2121-12.
- Ties will be broken on the basis of the earliest Service Computation Date.

Before You Go Any Further, Here Are Some Other Things You Need to Know

- United States citizenship is required. (Proof of citizenship will be required to be shown upon appointment.)
- If you are a male between the ages of 18 and 26 or were born after December 31, 1959, certification is required at the time you are employed that you have registered with the Selective Service for the draft, unless Selective Service has approved a waiver for you.
- You must meet the requirements by the closing date of the announcement.
- The FRA has determined that railroad seniority rights, leaves of absence, and reemployment rights generally constitute an actual or an appearance of a conflict of interest. Employees may be required to divest themselves of such rights immediately upon hire if these rights are determined to constitute an actual or appearance of a conflict of interest. If employees are permitted to retain such rights, which is generally the case for Railroad Safety positions, the rights must be divested at the end of the one year probationary period. No waivers of this requirement will be granted.
- FRA employees are prohibited from owning railroad stock, except, under certain circumstances, as part of a diversified mutual fund.
- If selected, you will be subject to the Standards of Ethical Conduct applicable to all DOT employees.
- **TRAVEL EXPENSES:** Travel and transportation expenses WILL NOT be paid.
- **GOVERNMENT TRAVEL CARD REQUIREMENT:** You must be able to retain a Government contractor-issued travel card to be used for official business as a condition of employment. If unable to obtain and/or retain a card, you may be subject to removal. Those who fail to meet this condition of employment will have our offer of employment rescinded.
