Practice Tips

- Conduct thorough public and resource agency outreach and consultation at all stages in project development.
- Developing solid data and design reflecting environmental constraints early in the process leads to better documentation and decisions.
- Establish the approach to building a comprehensive project record early in the process.
- Consider ways to make documents shorter and more user friendly but be mindful of the requirements of various ways to present data (e.g. incorporation by reference vs. appendix).
- Project modifications should be brought to FRA's attention as early as they are discovered.
