

Why Regional Rail Planning?

- Better integrate rail projects with other transportation modes
- Promote greater involvement by stakeholders and build consensus
- Identify priorities that support logical sequencing of developing networks and efficient use of limited funding
- Yield more cost-effective investments
- Respond to PRIIA requirements



Regional Planning Goals


- Produce a consensus 40 year vision for intercity passenger rail transportation within a region
- Identify the potential multistate network of "candidate corridors" for further evaluation, planning, and implementation
- Identify institutional challenges and opportunities that exist related to the development and delivery of the vision for the region



What the Studies are <u>NOT</u>

- DOES NOT identify specific routes or alignments for corridors that make up the network
- ► DOES NOT identify specific station locations
- DOES NOT come to conclusions regarding capacity or operating feasibility
- DOES NOT represent a commitment to implementing specific projects

FRA Planning Efforts



Study Status Update

- Completed last stakeholder workshop for Southeast on November 14th in Raleigh, NC
- ► Final Stakeholder Meeting for Midwest on December 6th in Chicago, IL
- ► Draft Plans Spring 2018





Lessons Learned

- Stakeholders value opportunity for collaboration
- Demonstrate advantages of planning in network context
- Recognize reality of needing to develop corridors / network incrementally
- Maintain flexibility in long-term vision
- Benefit in continuing collaboration after study completion
