Created by an Act of Congress in 1966 (The Department of Transportation Act), the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) is one of nine agencies that make up the U.S. Department of Transportation. FRA is composed of eight regional offices, in addition to our Washington D.C., headquarters, dedicated to keeping railroads and the public safe.

- Administering Federal funding in freight and passenger rail infrastructure and leveraging
 those strategic capital investments, as well as promoting the use of proven project delivery,
 management, and oversight tools.
- Continuously building strong and enduring partnerships (including public-private partnerships)
 across industry that foster a safe railroad operating environment and research for
 transformational technologies.

FRA has many programs and initiatives that help foster a safe railroad environment nationwide. Along with our partnerships, FRA personnel either sponsor or serve as representatives on boards, committees, and task forces that share information or provide forums for collaborative efforts.
